- B. - C. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the minutes from the 11/14/24 meeting were approved.

- F. New Business
- a. The Mayor presented for approval the 2025 City of Seymour Meetings schedule. On a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the request was approved.
- b. The Mayor presented for approval the 2025 City of Seymour Holiday schedule. On a motion by the Mayor, seconded by Mr. Earley, the schedule was amended to change President's Day and Columbus Day as floating holidays to decrease to number of Double Days at DPW. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the amended holiday schedule was approved.
- c. City Attorney Engleking asked for direction on pay continuation for the suspended police office discussed during the prior Board of Works meeting. On a motion by the Mayor, seconded by Mr. Earley, the pay will be terminated and the end of the current pay period, 11/30/24.
- d. City Engineer Bernie Hauersperger shared the following:
- Updated ADA transition plan and Title VI plan. These must be updated every 5 years. On a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the updated plan was approved.

- Property acquisition of the Shipp property, along with Change Order # 7 at the Southeast lift station project. There are no additional costs with the change order, but an actual \$1700 savings. On a motion by the Mayor, seconded by Mr. Lucas the acquisition and change order was accepted.
- LPA submittals for funding in 2030 – funding for O'Brien and 4th st.
- Transfer station project is underway.
- West 2nd St is going to be a mess through winter as they continue work on storm sewers from Community to Pine St.
- The Engineering department won the City Hall Christmas Tree decorating contest!! Good Job Bernie!

- Clerk/Treasurer Boas shared the bids that were due today for Fuel, Concrete, Stone, and Landfill. Only 2 bids were received, 1 for concrete and fill, and the other for landfill. Both bids are from current suppliers. Shelby materials rates went up about 4.5%, and Rumpke Landfill about 5%. On a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the Rumpke bid was accepted pending review by the Clerk/Treasurer. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the Shelby Materials bid was accepted.
- The Mayor presented a request for a dumpster at 702 N. Blish Street for a house clean out. This was approved via email.
- The Mayor presented a request for a food truck renew for Junkyard BBQ. All paperwork was in order. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.
- The Mayor recognized and congratulated Parks Admin Floyd Amburgey for conducting 400 weddings at City Hall.
