Reports from Committees, Boards, and Commissions

Councilman Storey discussed on behalf of Thorofare and Drainage committee the 1969
Ordinance regarding North Airport Road being renamed Hess Street. Drew requested the

between Second St. and Westgate Hess Street. This will not cause any address changes, and

Councilman Hackney introduced Ordinance No. 28, Council Bill 49 (2023), seconded by Councilman Wheeler, an Ordinance Amending the Salary of Temp Employees of the Parks Department for the year 2024 for second reading. (amending 2023 Ordinance 23, Council Bill No. 44). Temp employees were inadvertently listed at a start rate of \$15/hr., and it should have been \$10/hr. There was no change in total dollars allocated to this payroll line. On a motion by Mr. Hackney, seconded by Mr. Storey, the Ordinance second reading 5-0-2.

New Business

Councilman Hackney introduced Ordinance No. 29, Council Bill No. 50 (2023), seconded by Councilman Wheeler, an Ordinance. Of the Common Council of the City of Seymour, Indiana, Authorizing the Issuance of General Obligation Bonds for the Purpose of Providing Funds to Pay for Certain Capital Improvements and Incidental Expenses in Connection Therewith and on Account of the Issuance of the Bonds. This bond will replace the 2020 Capital bond that will be paid off this year. Primary uses for the bond are for Police vehicles and a replacement

firetruck. On a motion by Mr. Hackney, seconded by Mr. Wheeler, the Ordinance p	<u>assed first</u>
