**F. New Business**

i. The Mayor presented several requests for the Farmer's Market Lot:

1. Junk Yard BBQ, 8am to 2pm, Jan 26, Feb 9, Feb 23.  
On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.
2. Spudbank, 11am to 1 pm, Jan 18 & 25. On a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the request was approved.
3. Rolling Pig Pin, 11 am to 2 pm Jan 17 & 31, Feb 7 & 14.  
On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.
4. **Small Town Sweets, 8 am to Noon, Jan 20.**  
On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.

- ii. The Mayor presented a request for a road block donation event at Second and Walnut streets on Jan. 26<sup>th</sup>, from 2 to 4 pm. This helps support the Polar Plunge team and is an annual event. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.
- iii. The Mayor presented the following Taxi Cab renewals:
  - 1. Martelle Conner, 300 N. Chestnut. All paperwork was in order, so on a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the renewal was approved.
  - 2. Family 4 Life, 101 S Park St. All paperwork was in order, so on a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the renewal was approved.
- iv. The Mayor presented the following Mobile Food License for renewal: Lola's Modern Kitchen. All paperwork was in order, so on a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the renewal was approved.
- v. The Clerk Treasurer presented an update regarding Greg Pardieck and his Legal representative. They requested not to attend today and come back on 2/8. The last email with the Legal Rep. was shared, along with the balances owed, and the plans moving forward with the Village Green sewer bills.
- vi. City Engineer Bernie Hauersperger presented the following:
  - 1. Contract renewal for his services and FPBH Engineering. The contract represented a 4.8% increase in costs over the prior year of no increases. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the renewal was approved.
  - 2. Contract for approval for Nathan Fry of Clark Dietz. This was a renewal and serves to cover issues where there might be a conflict of interest between Bernie and his firm doing work for the City, with a similar cost increase to the FPBH agreement. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the renewal was approved.
  - 3. Bernie also submitted his annual Conflict of Interest form and on a motion by Mr. Lucas, seconded by Mr. Earley, the form was accepted.
  - 4. Bernie shared a change in a purchase agreement for permanent and temporary right of way for a WPC project.
  - 5. Bernie also shared he and Chad Dixon had been working on CCMG for 2024, and this year the possibility for a \$1.5 million matching grant was available, and that is what they are working toward.
- vii. The Mayor swore in Colin Smith for his 2<sup>nd</sup> year as Airport Manager/Director. Congratulations!

- viii. The Mayor nominated Mr. Earley for the Plan Commission. Dave accepted the nomination, and on a motion by the Mayor, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the appointment was confirmed.
- ix. The Clerk/Treasurer presented a request for an electric pole replacement on Sandy Creek Drive by Duke Energy. Duke also requested the fee of \$10 be waved, as the replacement was requested by the City. On a motion by Mr. Earley, seconded by Mr. Lucas, the request was approved.
