February 23, 2026

The February 23, 2026, Seymour City Council was called to order by Mayor Matt Nicholson at 7:00pm. The invocation was given by Rev. Thomas Clark and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. A virtual/steaming option was available.

Old Business:

- Councilman Hackney introduced Ordinance No. 3, Council Bill No. 4 (2026), seconded by Councilman Long for second reading, an ordinance amending Chapter 35 of the Seymour City Code to create an additional fund. This fund is for the in/out of the pool bond funds from BKOF where we will pay bills and deposit reimbursements. On a motion by Mr. Hackney, seconded by Mrs. Long, the ordinance passed second reading 7-0.

New Business

- Mayor Nicholson presented the State of the City Address for 2025. The Mayor touched on highlights of the City Departments, touching on training, achievements, growth, programs, volumes of people and products used or in attendance. The Mayor also touched on the tragedy that struck the Fire Department and brought rise to the Maverick Minute. Ongoing projects such as the City Pool renovations, Transfer station, Fire training facilities, Henry Way, and O'Brien Street. City finances ended the year strong, but next year would be challenging with the recent legislation at the

statehouse. The Mayor also touched on the partnership with JCIDC and what it brings to the community.

Miscellaneous Business

- Clerk Treasurer Boas shared the Stale Check listing from 2023, totaling \$8,535.78, with the Council and made it available for review if desired. These will be returned to the fund from which they came as required by the SBOA.
